53,590 INITIAL CALLS TO TENNESSEE POISON CENTER (TPC) IN 2019

TPC SAVES LIVES

- The TPC is the **only** poison control center in the state of Tennessee.
- Poisoning continues to be the leading cause of injury death in Tennessee.
- The TPC managed more than **106,114** calls in 2019 (includes initial cases and follow-up calls).
- Poison control is **not** just for children!
- **58%** of exposure calls in 2019 involved pharmaceuticals.
- The TPC has two board-certified medical toxicologists who are on call 24/7.



TPC IS DEDICATED TO PREVENTING PEDIATRIC POISONINGS



- **49%** of poisonings reported to the TPC in 2019 involved children age five years and under.
- Unintentional medication exposures remain a serious threat to young children.
- Safe storage of potentially toxic items and teaching children to "Ask First" will prevent a poison emergency.

TPC PARTNERS WITH THE STATE OF TENNESSEE ON EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS



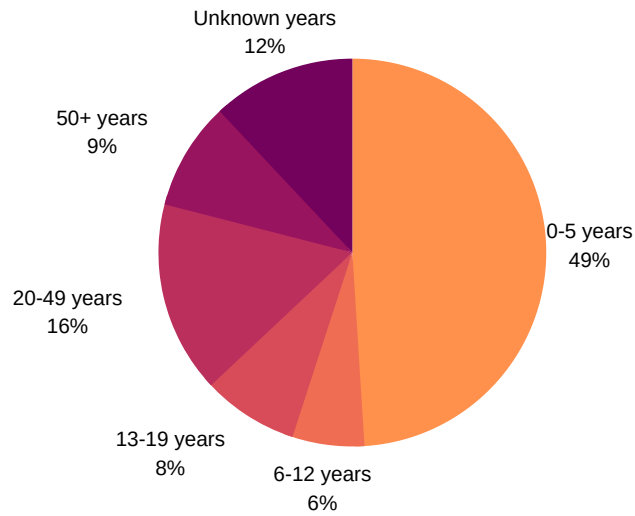
- The TPC partners with the TN Department of Health and county health departments to monitor public health events and possible chemical and biological threats.
- In the event of a national or public health emergency, the TPC maintains the surge capacity to handle a large volume of calls.

TPC PREVENTS UNNECESSARY ED VISITS AND SAVES MONEY FOR TAXPAYERS

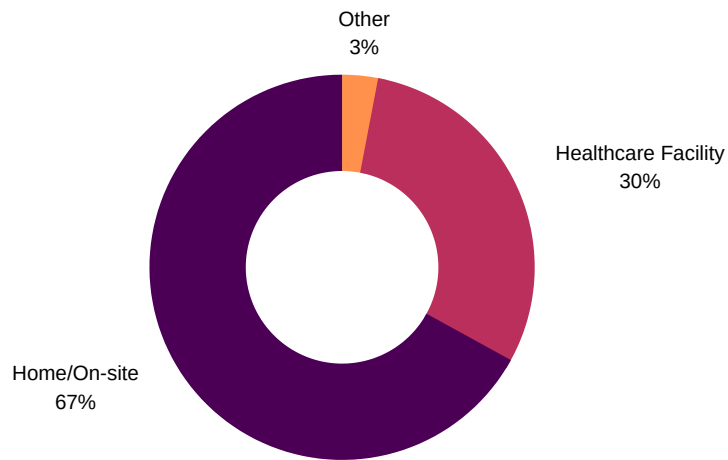
- In 2019, the TPC saved Tennessee taxpayers more than **\$18.1 million** by preventing unnecessary emergency department visits for the underinsured.

The Poison Help hotline available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days per year.

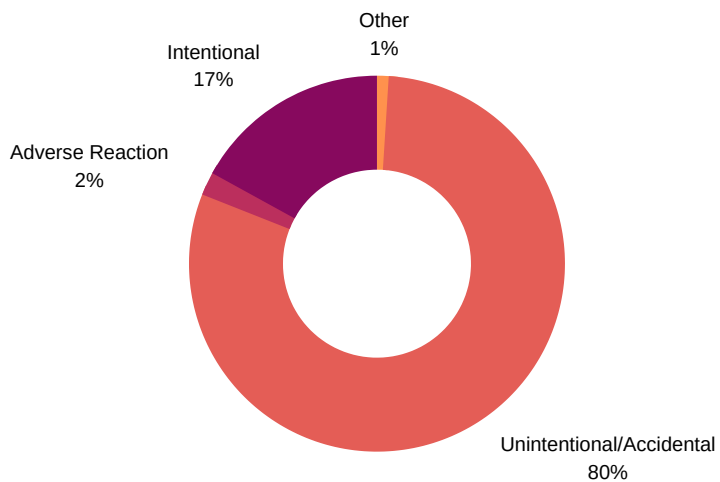
AGE OF POISONED PATIENT IN YEARS



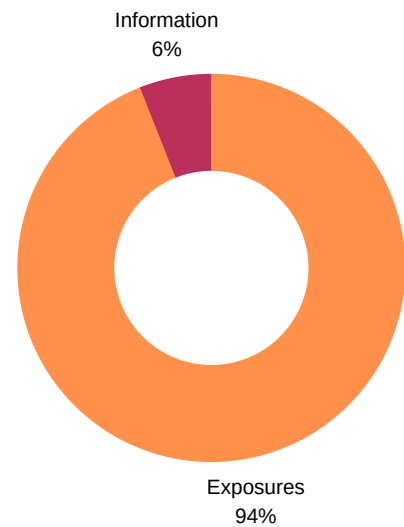
WHERE POISON EXPOSURE IS MANAGED



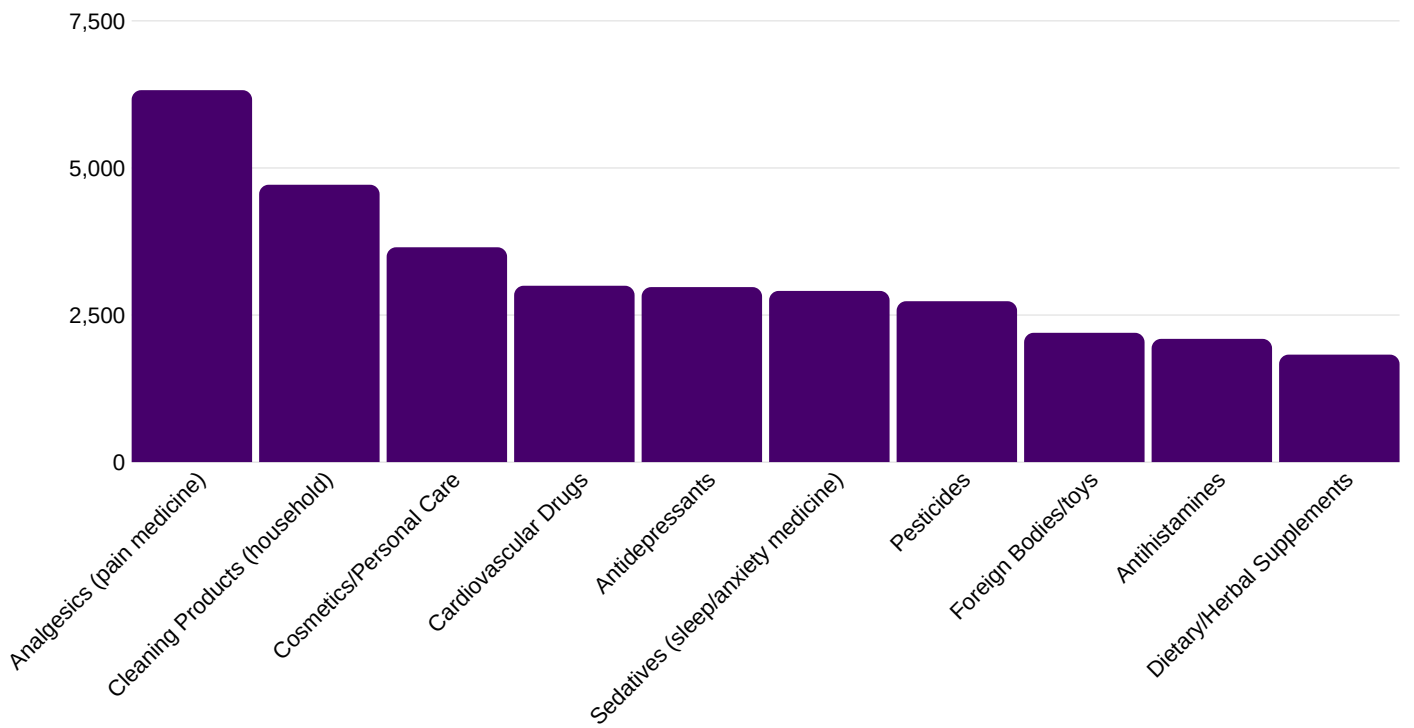
REASON FOR EXPOSURE



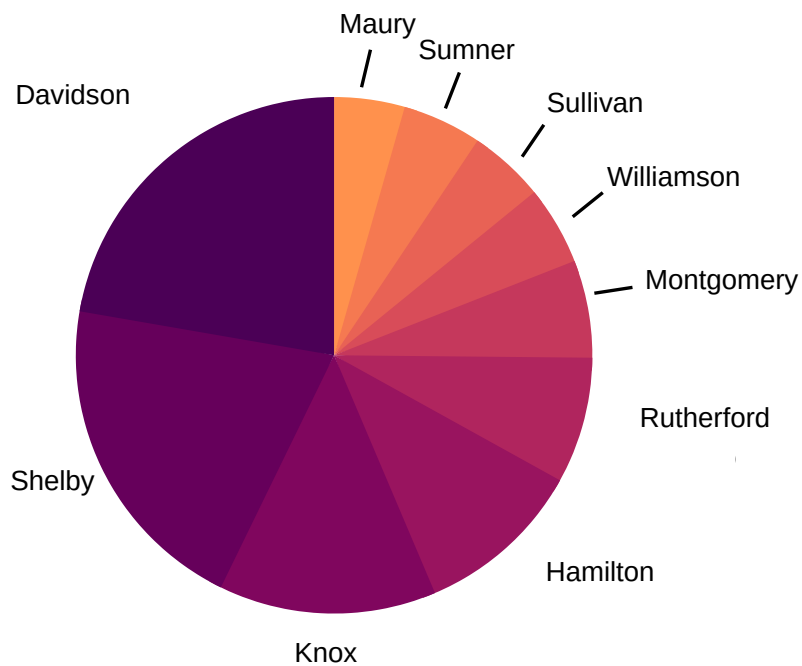
CALL TYPE
